❖ Background:

Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan- (The Organization of Strong Women Alone) Rajasthan's is an organization of strong Low-income widows and single women from the weaker sections of the society. Women from all castes, religions, and ages are associated with it. The Organization is consistently working in Rajasthan for social, economic and cultural empowerment of single women and for them to have dignity of life, along with their constitutional rights. Currently, the Organization is working in 33 districts covering 92 blocks and for that organization has conducted various activities during the year.

Our Vision

Organization envisions a society in which women of all religions, race, caste, class, and age live as empowered citizen and live a life of dignity and respect attaining all their legal, social, cultural and economic rights.

Geographical Coverage:

ENSS is currently actively working in 92 development blocks spread over 33 districts of Rajasthan. Organization is working on empowering and organizing single women and make them to support each other and collectively find solutions of their problems. Presently about 94,557 single women are members of the organization in different capacities.

Our Goal and Objectives:

Single women from all religions, castes, class and age collectively with each other's support make their lives better and at the same time support other women from marginalized communities for a just and equal society.

Objectives:

- To empower women for a life free of any kind of violence and atrocities and capacitate them to claim their rights on property and land.
- To make single women realize the power of the collective, and to change the cultural/traditional harmful and orthodox practices that make single women vulnerable.
- To make the single women welfare schemes/ laws implemented and monitor that they are being executed in a better way.
- To support single women in availing government schemes and with collective efforts link them with income generating schemes and activities.

Successful Case Study

Hum Ekal hain par Akeli nahi ! (We are single but not alone !)

Gayatri bai is a widow, resident of village Bindo, Tehsil Jhalra Patan , district Jhalawar. She was abandoned by her family after becoming a widow. She started living in her maternal home which is in Hemda panchayat, block Sunel, and district Jhalawar. First she joined the group and with support from single women leaders she accessed government schemes and got benefits. After that, with support from single women leaders, she tried to get her share in the land at her marital home. But since her parents-in-law were still alive, she was unable to get her share in land. For her share, single women leaders made attempts for some mid-way or compromise but her father-in-law did not give her land. Now, some time back, after her in-laws passed away, her *Dewar and jait* (brothers in law) were not giving Gayatri her due share of the land. Then some leaders and Organization staff went to her marital home, had a meeting with her brothers-in-law, but they refused completely. Then they were threatened that if they will not give her share then an FIR will be lodged against both of them and then legally they have to give her land. They got frightened and got ready to give her due share in land. Single women leaders divided the property and got it documented on a stamp duty paper. She got her due share of land - 5 bighas of land and also got a share in her father-in-law's house to live. Now Gayatri Bai is living in her marital home and makes a living for herself and for her children by farming on her land. With the strength of the women's collective, Gayatri Bai could take her due share, her right to property and land. Gayatri Bai says, "Had the single women – my sisters -- not been with me, I would have just died in going to the court alone time and again but wouldn't have been able to get my rights." She thanked all her fellow members and tells everyone about the strength of the collective. She doesn't miss a single meeting and also motivates others to be active.

Main Activities of the Organization

Panchayat level meetings:

Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan facilitated single women's monthly meetings covering 500 gram panchayats spread over 108 blocks of Rajasthan. These meetings were attended by 76,865 single women, 15,183 non-single women, 4,660 men, 1,443 elected representatives and administrative persons. In these meetings, the main issues discussed were – social security schemes, ration (PDS), MNREGA (employment scheme), women farmers, violence against women, right to land and property, voter awareness, untouchability and social discrimination. Problems shared by the single women were also resolved in these meetings.

Block Committee Members Meetings:

These meetings are organized in each block once in a year. This year in the month of May and June in 70 blocks, block committee members' meetings were organized. More than 1,400 block committee members participated in these meetings. In these meetings, district committee members were selected and discussions were held on issues of single women at the block level. Some key issues discussed were - Due to the closure of the food security online registration portal, women are not getting benefits of food security; pensions and child support entitlements were not received for many months; single women were not getting work in MNREGA etc. After the discussions, the block committee members prepared plans for future courses of action.

Single women leaders' state level meetings:

Single women leaders' state level meetings are organized three times in the year in which three state level members from each district participate. In the state level meetings organized this year single women leaders discussed the matters such as issues of single women at the state level, resolutions sought for the problems, reporting of the work done during the year, review and analysis of the strategies framed for single women, and what issues need to be taken up in the coming year. It emerged that there is a need to work strongly on some issues which include children's sexual harassment, empowering women farmers, observation of women farmer's day, celebration of *behnadooj* (sisterhood solidarity) and strengthening panchayat level work. A detailed plan was prepared based on the discussion.

Executive Committee Members Meetings: Meeting of the Executive Committee of the organization is held thrice in a year. This year, four meetings were organized in which the Organization's budget, activity planning, appointment of the workers, evaluation of the team members, assessment of the field work and future work planning was done. Other issues discussed were new issues to be worked upon and to identify new donors. Some important decisions were also taken.

General Body Meeting: General Body meetings are held once in a year, but due to some emergent reasons, meetings were held twice this year – on 27 July 2023 and 2nd February 2024. In these meetings, issues discussed were - organization's future action plan, appointment of the chartered accountant, budget approval and transferring of organization's bank accounts to Kota and change in the registered office address. Accordingly, decisions were taken on these matters.

Worker meetings: Single women block coordinators meetings are organized every month in which block facilitators from 92 blocks participate. Every month, block-wise work reports are discussed and planning for the next month is done. Besides this work, issues /problems are resolved and sharing of experiences were facilitated.



Success Story

Waqif kahan zamana hamari udaan Se
(The World is not aware of my flight...)



Koshish Karne walon ki kabhi haar nhin hoti ! (Those who try never lose!)

This was made possible by the unity of the single women and their collective strength. Simma Devi is an Anganwadi Worker in Gram Panchayat Chidiyan Gandhi, Tehsil Nohar, District Bhadra. Her centre was being run near the village well. Children had to cross by the well to go to the centre. Parents did not want to risk their children's life. So they refused to send their children to the Anganwadi centre. Anganwadi Worker informed the department many times but her repeated efforts just fell on deaf ears. Anganwadi Worker was suggested to give her complaint in writing which she did too but still nothing happened. When ENSS block leader went to the village, Anganwadi worker shared the problem of her centre. Then all the single women got together and went to the Panchayat bhawan, introduced themselves and about the organization and explained the Anganwadi centre's problem to the sarpanch sahib. They told the sarpanch that AWC is being run at a risky place and if anything wrong happens to the children who will be held responsible for that !

Department is not paying any attention to this matter despite the repeated complaints. Being a sarpanch you are aware of safe places available in the village and you can give one of those safe places where children are also safe and can go to the Anganwadi without any fear. Sarpanch got impressed with the empowered single women's leadership that with in 4-5 months he gave a land on lease for the Anganwadi centre. Now Anganwadi centre will be built on this land. Villagers said that single women's sangathan resolved the problem which could not be resolved by the village and government since months.

Action against the corrupt supervisor.....

There was a supervisor from the Department of Women and Child Development one supervisor from the Department of Women and Child Development in Etawa block of district Kota who would take bribes of Rupees 2,000/- per month from the Anganwadi (nursery school) workers working under her. Supporting the Anganwadi workers, single women leaders were fighting against this supervisor since 2019, demanding some departmental action. In the name of departmental action, she would be transferred to other blocks but again she would come back using her approach and connections with higher authorities. Her political connections with people in power and her influence was well known. In May 2022 single women leaders along with the affected Anganwadi workers filed a complaint in the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) and the supervisor was caught red handed. Despite that, the supervisor could not be arrested because of her approach. The Department did not give permission to the ACB for any legal proceedings, so nothing happened. Collectively single women continued to create pressure on the government and the department. Finally, supervisor got arrested and legal proceedings were started against her. Collective strength of single women won the fight.



Capacity Building Trainings for Single Women Leaders

Capacity Building Training for Leaders at the Panchayat Level:

Block Facilitators organize regular monthly meetings and mobilize single women to collectivize and resolve the problems with each others' support. They raise important collective issues and problems.

This year, five capacity building trainings were organized in field area of Kota, Udaipur, Jodhpur, Karoli and Sikar in which 435 single women leaders from 44 blocks participated. They got an new understanding of issues and problems faced by single women, got aware of the political and administrative structures, and about the women's rights on land and property. During these trainings, leaders learnt what should be done in case of harassment and violence against women. They were oriented about the government schemes and how single women can be empowered by being organized.

The Organization holds capacity building training programs on various themes considering the needs of the leaders so that the facilitators' capacity keeps on being strengthened and nurtured. This year training programs were organized on the issues of women's land rights, women farmers and organic farming, how to strengthen work with single women at the block level, developing understanding on child abuse and harassment. These trainings proved useful in strengthening work at the block level.

Exposure Visits

Exposure Visit to Tirupati, Andhra Pradesh:

On 23rd May 2023, a meeting was organized in the District Collectorate office in Tirupati, Andhra Pradesh. In this meeting, RYSS (Rayatu Sadikara Smastadh), Andhra Pradesh, was introduced, and information was given that this is an organization that works on natural farming in the whole of Andhra. This meeting was attended by 20 representatives from 9 NGOs. In this meeting, we were informed that in Tirupati, natural farming is done on 285 hectares of land and that they are working in 33 mandals. They have formed work models which are called DPM which are further divided in 1-3 levels.

- Team at level 1: Works as Master Trainer who is responsible for 2-3 clusters.
- Team at level 2: is responsible for 3-4 gram panchayats.
- Team at level 3: works for 2-3 village level groups and works under guidance of Level 2 team.

During this visit, exposure to the fields of farmers practising natural farming was organized. From ENSS Rajasthan two women farmer leaders, Mansha Devi and Vishnu Kanwar, participated in this exposure visit. This was first time that RYSS has given opportunity to participants from other organization to participate in their training program.

RYSS (Rayatu Sadikara Smastadh Andhra Pradesh) organization in collaboration with RJIVIKA organized a five days training on natural farming in Dausa in which four women farmers from Dausa and one women farmer leader from Dausa participated. Resource person were 3 women farmers from RYSS. This training was held in three villages. During the training participants learnt about different models of natural farming. Along with it, they learnt about how to prepare pesticides. After the training women farmer leaders shared their experiences and committed that they will prepare these kind of models in their own land and also will teach this knowledge to other women farmers.

Shared journey of Community Based Organizations (CBOs) 17-21 March 2024:

A shared journey of women's CBOs was organized in Kama Hotet, Ahmdabad from 17-21st March 2024 in which representatives of eight women organizations from four states of India (Rajasthan, Gujrat, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal) participated. The main objective of this shared journey was to emphasise that after a long journey, a halt is important to relook at the road taken, reflect on that, absorb the learning of the long travel physically, emotionally and mentally and then resume the travel going forward. No travel completes without doing this exercise. During this five days travel, all co-travellers shared about their experience, challenges and learnt from each others' experience. They refreshed their memories and tried to deeply understand the feminist movements and the organizational work so that some new aspects could be identified. In this travel five participants participated from the Organization in Rajasthan. For this, participants from the Organization put the journey together on the flip charts. A field visit was also organized during this travel which was exciting as well as informative.

Celebration of special 'Sisterhood Day' with enthusiasm

“ BehnadooJ ke rang mahila matdata ke sang”
(Colour of sisterhood with women voters)

BehnadooJ- 'a celebration of sisterhood'- This time this celebration was special and organized from 16 to 22 November 2023. Because there was Code of Conduct in effect due to the legislative assembly elections and there was ban on public functions. So the program was observed with an interesting theme – women as voters! There were 3 mega celebrations at a district level, 7 big programs were at block level and the day was celebrated in 171 gram panchayats. About 3,103 participants actively participated in these celebrations. The theme of these programs was –

'BahinadooJ ka rang, mahila matdata jagrukta ke sang' (Sisterhood's color with women voters' awareness). During the program, single women came wearing colorful red chunri and enjoyed the celebration. In some places, the Single Women organized a rally, discussion meetings, songs, slogans and street plays and spread awareness about casting the invaluable vote to elect the right candidate. This time cordial cooperation was received from the Election Commission, the District Councils (Zila Parishad) and the Department of Social Justice and Empowerment.

Observation of International Women Farmers' Day

Observation of International Women Farmers' Day was held with great enthusiasm in 43 panchayats of 30 blocks by single women leaders in which 791 women farmers participated. On the occasion of Women Farmers' Day single women leaders organized different activities such as meetings at the panchayat level, conferences, workshops and rally at the block level. During the programs, discussion was held on a range of issues like identity building of women farmers, their access to resources, traditional farming, seeds conservation, women's experiences, and

women's participation in agriculture, devolution in traditional culture, environment conservation and organic farming.

During the discussion women accepted that women do 75% of the agriculture work but they are not acknowledged as 'farmers'. The Farmer is considered someone who has land in his/her name and rural women usually do not own land. Women are not even allowed to spend the money that they have earned by selling their crop. That's why in comparison to men, women's participation is minimal or negligible in decision-making. Some of the participants shared the harms of chemical use in farming saying that due to chemical farming everyone is consuming poison and also we are getting affected by various diseases. To avoid all this, we should do the farming using old traditional methods. Our identity - Woman Farmer.

8 March- Celebration of International Women's Day

Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan celebrated International Women's Day (8th March) with great enthusiasm in the work area covering 21 panchayats spread over 21 blocks. Observing the women's day all women, including single women, organized different activities - panchayat level discussion meetings, slogan writing, rallies etc. Discussion was held on a range of issues such as different kinds of violence faced by women, safe workplaces, and participation in panchayats, constitutional rights and gender equality. Women fully enjoyed the celebrations.

Celebration of International Widow Day (Single Women's Empowerment Day)

Celebration of International Widow Day (Single Women's Empowerment Day) was celebrated from 17 to 23rd June by single women leaders in their respective field areas. Celebrations included meetings at the MNREGA work locations, discussion groups, rally etc. In these meetings discussion was held on the status of single women globally, violence and harassment faced by them, social evils, caste-based discrimination, patriarchal mind sets and constitutional rights, and on problems faced by single women. This program was organized in more than 70 blocks.

Women's Safety and Counselling Centre- Kota

Mahila Surksha Evm Salah Kendra, Kota City

In the year 2011, the Government of Rajasthan gave responsibility of running the Women's Safety and Counselling Centre - Kota city to Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan. For last 13 years, the Organization is running it successfully. In the year 2023, the Govt. of Rajasthan advertised and started some more such centers. Considering the work of the Organization, again responsibility to run all the centers in Kota city was given to the organization. In the year 2023-24 421 cases were received by the centre out of which 413 were resolved and 8 cases are under consideration. In 413 cases, problems were resolved by giving advice, through counselling and guidance. Details of the work of the Centre are given below:

- 9 cases are supported in getting *stree- dhan* returned after separation
- 21 women were supported in getting custody of their children
- 47 cases facing problems were facilitated in lodging an FIR and police complaint
- 1 homeless woman was helped in getting into a shelter home
- 182 women were supported in protecting their right to live in their marital home
- 10 women were helped in getting free legal aid
- 28 women were helped in filing case under Domestic Violence (Protection) Act
- 17 cases were facilitated to have adequate legal action
- Counsellors participated in two workshops on the theme, "making society violence free"
- 13 victim women were helped in getting protection and action on the concerning persons
- Two cases were supported in getting judicial orders regarding maintenance
- In other cases, the Centre provided advice, guidance and counselling to the aggrieved women

About Strengthening of Organizational and Financial Structures

- Organizational structure got strengthened and Executive Committee's participation has increased in management.
- Executive members and other leaders are playing active roles in mobilizing donations so that organization gets financially stronger.
- Organization has its own independent accounts system.
- Organization's all legal compliances are completed on time.
- Currently organization has 12A and 80 G registrations.
- Single women leadership has become more active and their participation in decision making has increased.

Experiences and Case Study of the Literacy Camp Being Run by the Organization

Single women and leaders associated with Ekal Nari Shakti Sansthan are not weak by any means. Some women facilitators have hidden potential of leadership and they are strong leaders too, also working in their field area very efficiently, but they lack literacy skills, and this lack imposes a big challenge for them. For the last three years, the Organization is running literacy classes for 6 months for strong but illiterate single women leaders, volunteers. As a result of this initiative, many single women leaders started reading and writing themselves and an uplift in their confidence level was seen.

This year, from June to November 2023, the Organization organized 5 literacy camps in which along with one worker, 8-10 single and other women learnt reading and writing. These five camps were held in Dausa, Tonk, Hanumangarh, Dholpur, Jhalawar districts in which 46 women learnt reading and writing.

Some Experiences Shared by the Women:

Jamila Bano: I am 50 years old and I am working as block facilitator in Panchayat Mendwas, district Tonk. Being illiterate I was facing many challenges during my work. I had to request others time and again and seek their support. After joining the literacy class, now I have learnt reading and writing and 7 other women had also learnt reading and writing with me. Although it was difficult to learn in this age, but we have achieved it! Now I am very happy.

Chunni Bai: She was 48 years old and resident of Lalsot in Dausa. She is very strong with immense leadership skills. Chunni Bai says, "Due to my illiterate status, anyone could make me a fool. Many times, an officer would humiliate me and shoo me away. I would feel hurt, and always would think that had I been literate, I would not have to face this humiliation! Then I joined a literacy class run by the Organization for six months and have learnt reading and writing. Now when I go to the field, I do all my reading and writing work myself. I am feeling very happy after achieving this."
